- Thinkers: We exercise initiative in applying thinking skills critically and creatively.
- Communicators: We understand and express ideas and information confidently and creatively in a variety of ways.
- Principled: We act with integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness.
- Open-minded: We understand and appreciate our own cultures and are open to the perspectives, values and traditions of others.
- Caring: We show empathy, compassion and respect towards the needs and feelings of others.
- Risk-takers: We approach unfamiliar situations and uncertainty with courage to explore new roles, ideas, and strategies.
- Balanced: We understand the importance of intellectual, physical, and emotional balance to achieve personal well being.
