Art Remote Learning Project #2

Let's refine your upcycling skills with a focus on a particular category.

Choose one eco-savvy artist challenge from categories below.

Category is ... collaborative game/toy, musical instruments, 3D freestanding robot, wearable art or puppets.

EQ'S: What art form can you practice that will make you a better global citizen of the future? How many reusable resources can you list to make art with?



Student activity time:

- Utilize you weekly 35-minute art time each week to Live Zoom with me and your classmates to discuss, answer questions, brainstorm and share out our creative ideas, source visuals and engage in other lesson specific activities.
- Utilize the rest of your week/weekend to schedule in time to work collaboratively with adult supervision to continue work independently on your Upcycled Artwork.

Procedure: Week 1-2 I can research and explore examples from a particular category and investigate their design to inspire my own unique design Week 2-3 I can brainstorm and record my ideas, I can design a rough draft and list materials needed, Week 3-4 I can acquire materials needed to Upcycle and begin to design and create 1 of the eco-friendly themed challenges.
Week 4-5. I can edit, refine and complete my work. I can write an artist statement describing my work, listing all materials and creative process

Objective: Students will be able to design, create 1 eco-friendly themed project of their choice to upcycle. Students will be able to research and explore examples from a particular category and investigate designs that inspire their work and write an artist statement to inform their viewers.

From the beginning of time, people have recycled, repurposed and reused, making their homes, clothing, utensils, toys and art from what was readily available in their environment.



Recycled, or "found," materials are abundant, sustainable resource for creative self-expression. Recycling unwanted things is great fun and it's not going to cost you very much at all... as all of the main ingredients in these projects were

heading for the garbage! So, don't throw away your left -over boxes, egg cartons, paper rolls, paper plates and cups as there are some more outstanding projects you can design!



Find inspiration in examples that are appealing to you and investigate their design! **TIPS: to consider when choosing your category.**

- Your game/toy can be cooperative, competitive or for individual use.
- Your musical instrument can be a beautifully designed model and/or actually produces sound.
- Your jewelry or accessory design can be for your own enjoyments or given as a gift ex. a bracelet or necklace, a. hat or a pocketbook book bag etc.
- Your Robot must be freestanding and have geometric 3d form
- Your puppet can be sock, stick, bag or marionet like puppet.


