JAM Clubs	Description
<b>ART</b>	The purpose of the art club is to provide students who have an interest in art, an opportunity to explore art and craft forms beyond what is offered in the curriculum. It gives students the opportunity to work individually and in groups.
<b>Dance</b>	The purpose of the dance club is to boost up the morale of students and to highlight the talent of dance and creativity. It provides opportunities to dance lovers to prove their talent and it is a good platform for them to have their artistic exploration.
<b>Math</b>	The purpose of the math club is to develop students' level of Math skills and knowledge. This will be accomplished by using games, activities, and mock competitions. Students will cooperatively work to complete Logic and Math Puzzles.
<b>Student Council</b>	The purpose of the student council is to give students an opportunity to develop leadership by organizing and carrying out school activities and service projects. In addition to planning events that contribute to school spirit and community welfare, the student council is the voice of the student body.
<b>Honor Society</b>	National Elementary Honor Society promotes the four pillars of scholarship, responsibility, service, and leadership early on. Through exploration of each pillar, student members learn many valuable life lessons, including the importance of personal responsibility and giving back to the community.
<b>Chess</b>	The chess club teaches a variety of skills, including visualization, critical thinking and problem solving. Students can then use those skills in their classes, and some studies show students who play in after-school or in-school chess clubs tend to get better grades in math.
<b>Leadership</b>	This club will foster our 6th grade students' desire to become servant leaders in one's community. To build public speaking skills, community service and respect for others and self through positive action. To provide experience in working with others to achieve a common goal.
<b>Yearbook</b>	Yearbooks help us remember our classmates, school events, achievements, and trends of the time. Yearbook club helps students to learn a variety of skills that will be useful to them in the future, especially when pursuing their careers. This includes how to communicate more effectively, handle problems, grow as a leader, manage their time, and meet important deadlines.
<b>Entrepreneurship</b>	The purpose of the Entrepreneurship club is to teach students crucial life skills that will help them navigate this uncertain future. These skills include problem-solving, teamwork, empathy, as well as learning to accept failure as a part of the growth process.
<b>Debate</b>	The Debate club encourages higher-order and critical thinking skills. It teaches students to structure and organize their thoughts while also developing their analytical, research, and presentation skills.
<b>Book</b>	The Book club's purpose is to help foster curiosity and a habit of learning. The book club keep scholars accountable for reading more books than they might otherwise, the carry-on effect of learning is more likely to happen. The book club will enable students to learn from the freedoms given, which lead to a deeper understanding of their reading, developing deeper understanding of other people through their conversations, and providing opportunities to safely fail and celebrate success. Book clubs also increase communication. When scholars read books with a group of people they want to talk to others about it, and when they talk they instantly become less isolated! Scholars also feel more confident to discuss different topics in school or at home. Reading lets scholars experience their emotions in a safe space.

<b>Media</b>	The purpose of the Media club is to equip students with the skills and tools to communicate their ideas through different media including the newspaper, social media, the JAM news and other outlets to enhance family and community engagement. Students will learn about video editing, writing short news bulletins, photography and animations.
<b>Male Mentorship</b>	Purpose: Akoben Enterprises Incorporates practices that support the healthy maintenance and sustainability of a community's mission, core values and identity. Provides culturally relevant practices centered on rites of passage, restorative practices, social and emotional learning, mindfulness disciplines, affirmative development, academic motivation, and career paths.
<b>Homecoming</b>	The club will help develop and create buildingwide displays, activities, and fundraisers for homecoming. Homecoming is the tradition of welcoming back alumni or other former members of an organization to celebrate the organization's existence.
